"... the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead?

He is not here but has risen ..." — Luke 24:5

Happy Easter!!

The verse above from Luke comes from this Gospel's account of Jesus' glorious resurrection, which all four of the Gospels, of course, are overjoyed to tell! And we are overjoyed to hear!

The angelic "men" of Luke 24:5, in their dazzling white, surprise the women who have come with their spices, planning to care for the entombed Jesus. What they proceed to say to the women might seem particularly harsh, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen." The men wonder why the women expect Jesus to remain still among the dead?

Jesus had openly talked with His disciples and followers not only about the necessity that He die, but also about the certainty of His rising again! The angels at the tomb pull no punches about the mindset with which the women come to the tomb, compared to the one they should have had. For them, the women ought to have come to the tomb looking for the Living, expecting to find Jesus among the Living! Instead, the women had given in to the end that Jesus was dead and surrendered the hope that He lives! After their tough question, the angels then seek to inspire the women, devoted followers of Jesus that they are, with the Easter news that Jesus is not there among the dead! He is risen, and among the Living!

Luke's account offers a valuable lesson to us this Easter! It reminds us to be careful about our mindset!

We all believe in a Resurrected, Living Jesus! "He lives. He lives. Christ Jesus lives today," we sing at Easter. "He walks with me and talks with me along life's narrow way." And yet, our mindset can often struggle to show the confidence that Jesus abides with us, ready to empower us out



of the immeasurable abundance of Living Power that raised Him from the tomb! Do we, like the women who visited Jesus' tomb, drift into expecting Jesus to be among the dead? ... among that which has lost its Living Power?

We also sing at Easter and throughout the year the joyous song given to us by the Gaithers and their musical family, "Because He Lives, I can face tomorrow. Because He lives, all fear is gone ... and life is worth the living just because He lives." We love singing this for the same reason we love singing "He Lives" and "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today" and "Up from the Grave He Arose" and all the other great Easter songs ... because we believe it! We believe in the Power of God that raised Jesus to life! We believe that nothing is impossible for God! With God's help, let us take the next steps of faith and trust it! Let us expect it, where we can't yet see it!

Why? Just Because! Just Because He Lives! ... living so powerfully among us, with us, and through us! We may not yet know what Jesus is going to help us do next, with all His Power, Just Because He Lives! But we have all the evidence around us to know what Jesus has already done in our lives and in the lives of others, with all His Power, Just Because He Lives!

Happy Easter! ... and may you and yours be richly blessed by the hope and confidence that Jesus is busily active among the Living and that life is abundantly worth the Living Just Because Jesus Lives!

REPORT FROM THE TRUSTEES PROPERTY COMMITTEE

As usual, the Trustees Property Committee is always busy; there is always something going on, or something that needs done.

Phase II of the organ repairs has been completed. I am getting updated prices on the future repair work. Once I have that I will share the status of where we are with the Sounds of John Wesley Capital Campaign, moving forward.

There is always ongoing maintenance required inspections... monthly, quarterly, annually. We have recently had several annual inspections done or to be scheduled. Those include:

- ~ Inspection of the Kitchen fire suppression hood -- done
- ~ Annual state elevator inspection to be scheduled
- Annual state boiler inspection done, waiting on certificate

We have lots of plans for 2024 and improvements to the buildings. Items recently done or being looked at:

~ Church building at 129 N. Potomac Street ~

- An audio Hearing Assist Transmitter Unit has been installed in our Sound System due a failure in the existing unit. Our hearing assist units should now be once again functional.
- A replacement high temperature submersible pump has been ordered for the Boiler Room.
- Several rooms in the building have received some deep cleaning for our new users: the Chapel, Room 114, and the Nursery.
- There are plans currently being discussed for improvements and easier upkeep for the courtyard area, also known as the "John Wesley Memorial Garden."
- We have also been looking at some possible renovations to the downstairs Ladies restroom.
- The NA group has asked for permission to paint the walls in their area, which should help freshen up that area.

~ Rowe Hall, located to the rear of 129 N. Potomac Street ~

 Work is currently being done in the basement of Rowe Hall to lighten and brighten the area... adding the missing ceiling, painting the floors and walls, and updating of the restroom area.

~ 131 N. Potomac Street (former parsonage and office) ~

- We had some recent repairs done to the roof after noticing some missing shingles.
- The back door frame may need work, and we will need to re-evaluate the erosion under the back ramp sidewalk area.

TRUSTEES PROPERTY COMMITTEE CONTINUED

~ Parsonage on Hamilton Blvd. ~

- A replacement washing machine was recently delivered and hooked up.
- A concrete pad is scheduled to be laid at the grill area in the spring. We are reviewing estimates for a few other exterior repairs and improvements to be done at the same time.

Current building use by outside organizations:

Chapel - Starting on March 17, New Light Metropolitan
Community Church began using our Chapel on Sundays at 1:30
for their worship service, as they continue their search for a new church home.

Basement Area - Hope & Gratitude, an NA 12-step group, continues to use our basement area twice a week for evening meetings. At least twice a year, they use the Social Hall and Kitchen for special events.

Kitchen - Kitchen Committee and Property Committee are currently in talks with an individual for renting space in the kitchen.

Other church building spaces - There are several organizations or individuals using various rooms and space within the church building for meetings, crafting, outreach counseling, and distribution of items to the less fortunate and the homeless.

Rowe Hall - Home Sweet Home Foundation, a non-profit organization helping foster children who are aging out of the Foster Care system is currently occupying Rowe Hall.

a fun Flower Frog

A flower frog sits atop a vase to help arrange flowers and hold stems in place. This personalized frog will become a favorite!

What you need:

- Air-dry clay
- Roller
- Vase (or jar)
- Plastic knife
- Straw
- Acrylic paint and brushes



What you do:

- 1. Roll out a portion of clay to about ½-inch thickness.
- 2. Cut out a circle that's slightly larger than the vase opening. (This will allow the finished frog to sit securely on top.)
- To make holes for stems, use a straw to punch out circle shapes. If you make more than one frog, try arranging the holes in different patterns.
- 4. Let dry completely. Then personalize your work with acrylic paint.
- 5. When dry, place the frog atop the vase.




PUZZIE TITOLOGIO DE LA UNITADING BEAUTY
