



### **EASTER SUNDAY CROSS OF FLOWERS**

We are going to decorate our flower cross on Easter Sunday. Bring in any type of spring flowers from your home or a store to fasten to the chicken wire around the wooden cross.

Please arrive a little early before the service starts so that we can get the flowers in place. After the service, we will share the cross with the neighborhood outside our doors. Thank you for your participation.











First a little history about our scholarship program. Around 1975 the Startzman family left \$25K as a protected principle and the interest/earnings generated by the \$25K to be used for scholarships. Over the years a record of interest/ earnings/loss was not kept, the \$25K became part of our endowment fund.



Scholarship Fund

The Leadership Team has made the decision that part of our total endowment fund is comprised of \$25K of the protected Startzman gift. Since there is not a guarantee of a positive return on our total investment, the Leadership Team decided on the following: on January 1st of each year determine the rate of a one year CD, on December 31st of the same year determine which is greater, the total return on the endowment fund or the rate of a fixed rate CD. This way if the total return is greater than the CD, this would be the amount eligible for scholarships, if the CD rate is greater, this would be the amount eligible for scholarships. This would guarantee a positive amount each year going into the scholarship fund. This money would then become restricted money designated for scholarships only on our balance sheet.

If people would like to make contributions to the scholarship fund, we would encourage them to do so. The scholarship committee would be made up of three volunteer members from the congregation. The chairperson would be the Leadership Chairperson; if there was to be a conflict of interest the Leadership Team would select another person. The chairperson would not have a vote, would be a facilitator only. The application has been changed to reflect that people who might be out of school but going back to school would be eligible, part time students would be eligible, and any type of higher education after high school, to include college, trade schools would be eligible. Applications would be due on or before the third Friday of April each year, available in the office. The Leadership Team is looking for applicants and three volunteers from the congregation to serve on the Scholarship Committee.


