



"A Study in the Book of James—Thrive: Living Faithfully in Difficult Times" By Jennifer Cowart




In *Thrive*, author and teacher Jen Cowart helps us develop the habits and attitudes necessary to thrive, whatever our circumstances. Discussion Topics:

You do not have to perform anymore. You are hidden in




As a former actor, Allison Allen knows what it is like to feel like she had to perform—not only for others, but even for God's favor.

THE SOUNDS OF JOHN WESLEY UMC — UPDATE

Moving into 2024 meant regrouping and updating our figures in The Sounds of John Wesley Capital Campaign. Prices have increased since we began this goal and we need to update our report accordingly. The new updated amounts are listed below.



To kick off our Sounds of John Wesley Capital Campaign, we started with some sound system upgrades in 2019. We initially had the Carillon Bells included in our goal, but were able to obtain funding elsewhere for that project. Therefore the balance of the work remaining evolves around the organ.

Our organ is insured for a \$1,332,000 replacement cost. The organ was built by M.P. Moller in Hagerstown in 1921, and subsequently rebuilt by Moller in 1942 and 1963. The organ was again rebuilt by the Reuter Organ Company in Lawrence, KS in 1993, but was not completely releathered at that time. Therefore the reason for most of this recent work we currently are having done.

The time came for some of these needed repairs to be done. We set them up in phases according to priority. Phase I and Phase II have been completed. A recent repair required the replacement of a rectifier. A second rectifier in the console will probably need replaced in the near future. That amount has been included in this revised price.

To quickly summarize where we are, using the new updated prices, the goal is:

Rectifier replacement in console	500.00
Phase III Expression Motor replacement	12,700.00
Phase IV Peterson Combination Action	<u>15,000.00</u>
FUTURE WORK TO COMPLETE	28,200.00
Work Already Completed	34,700.00
REVISED GOAL TOTAL	\$62,900.00

We have raised \$46,925.00 to date.

Therefore, there is still a need for \$15,975.00 to be able to accomplish the needed repairs when necessary in the future.

These figures do not include a contingency for routine maintenance or unexpected repairs.

We thank the congregation for your prayers, your commitment and your generosity to make this happen. We remind you that there are Sounds of JW envelopes included in your monthly giving envelope packet, or you can specify in your online giving.

LEADERSHIP TEAM REPORT - CHURCH GOALS

At the Leadership Team meeting on June 24, a subcommittee was appointed to begin drafting goals that match the missional direction approved by our congregational vote on June 23, 2024. The subcommittee is chaired by Ryan Chapin, Richard Willson and Pastor Doug Hoffman. Additional members who agreed to attend subcommittee meetings as they are able included Barbara Diefenderfer, Mary Licht, Jenny Suddueth and Susan Saunders.

The subcommittee has met every Monday morning since July 2nd and has created multi-year projections that can be used to test the merit of ideas for revitalizing our church, engaging in mission and enhancing income. The most immediate conclusion from this analysis is that if we do nothing we will run out

of money in 2030, a mere five years from now. Projections of increases in membership, stewardship and space rentals we have considered so far may extend our viability to 2034, so clearly additional work must be undertaken. We are exploring how we can make better use of rooms, our fast fiber connection to the Internet, our wedding-worthy sanctuary, our organ, our mission work and ways we can trim our spending without damaging ministry. We want your ideas, input and if you are willing, some of your time to work on small parts of this puzzle, like perfecting our policies around using the sanctuary for weddings or designing a stewardship campaign. Call one of us, or our church secretary, Karen Stamper, and we will get you connected.

The next several years will involve a lot of intense program planning, excellent communication, careful allocation of human and financial resources and the need to make sure that we do excellent leadership development. To this end, at least in the short term, recognize that we will have to carefully hire someone to assist with our planning and implementation of new ministries while keeping all of our subcommittee work connected with our larger work to win souls for Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

Make fluffy "moon sand" to build fun structures.


What you need:
