

#### "Remember the Sabbath" "Remember the Sabbath day, and keep it holy." — Exodus 20:8

The Commandment above, the 4th of the great 10 Commandments from God, recorded in Exodus 20, reminds us of how important it is, how essential it is, to rest! ... and how important it is to remember! Resting and remembering is how we keep the Sabbath holy.

Exodus identifies the Sabbath as a day. "Remember the Sabbath day," it says. However, Sabbath need not, and should not, be limited to a day. Jesus himself famously answered when questioned about the Sabbath, "Sabbath was made for humanity, not humanity for the Sabbath." (Mark 2:27) Sabbath came into being, first, to be a blessing to God! After God's 6 days of creation, the 7th day, the Sabbath day, offered God valuable rest! This rest was so valuable that God commanded into being a day for us to rest!

Our Sabbath day of rest can be extended to 2-day rest on a good, restful weekend: and to 3 days on one of those glorious holiday weekends! A day of rest becomes several days of rest, up to a week or more, when we take a vacation. Sabbatical Leave is offered by many employers, allowing employees to rest from their work for months at a time. A "sabbatical year" may even be taken by certain professions.

Summer often offers wonderful time for Sabbath! Perhaps you've already had valuable and restful vacation time this summer, are enjoying it right now, or have it coming up soon. In addition to the blessing of Sabbath during our vacations, summer relaxes many schedules and allows more time for Sabbath-like rest and

renewal. The kids are not burdened with "school nights" and homework. Many workplaces are used to summer schedules adjusted to their employees' time away, including those off days granted to devoted workers who have unexpected opportunities arise for a valuable family or personal day or long weekend away.



I love how the commandment about keeping Sabbath says that we must keep it HOLY! ... which is to say, "keep it Godly." Keep the Sabbath something that does God's will! Keep the Sabbath so that it blesses our relationship with God, grows our Love for God, and strengthens our bond with our Lord Jesus Christ!

It also stands out that the commandment about keeping Sabbath says that we must REMEMBER it! We must remember that God's awesome creation required that even God needed to rest! We must remember that! Remembering that helps us remember how unique and special God's days of creation were! It also helps us remember how unique our Oneand-Only God is!



And all this reminds us that there's no better time than Sabbath time, to remember what's most important for us to remember! ... about God, about ourselves, and about our relationship with God! There is truly no better time to remember and recall the Blessings God has bestowed upon us than while we are resting and relaxing from the daily and weekly toils of our lives! Resting and Remembering is how we keep Sabbath holy!

Last night, on a Monday night, on the spur of the moment, my family and I decided to take a drive out of town to a favorite theater to watch a movie we had been wanting to see. Normally, Monday nights for me are filled with meetings, and it's a school night for my daughter. But because it's summer, last night was a night free from all that. It was a night of rest, of Sabbath, and because of that, it became a movie night! And by the end of the day, it became a Sabbath for remembering, for remembering how special my family is! ... and why we love movies so much ... because of the love God has given us for stories and for telling stories, including the gifts God has given Calleigh for writing! It all helped our Monday be more Holy!

May you be richly blessed this Summer with Holy Sabbath that allows you to rest ... and remember!




### "Invitation to the Old Testament: Short-Term Disciple Bible Study"

- 8. Restoration & Renewal November 1







# THE SOUNDS OF JOHN WESLEY UMC - UPDATE

To recap the progress of the Sounds of John Wesley UMC Capital Campaign, we go back to 2019. Upon establishing the Sounds of John Wesley Campaign, we began by including Sound System upgrades (Note this was pre-pandemic modifications), new Carillon bells, a Music Ministry program, and organ repairs (3 phases), for an estimated total of \$70,000. All of these... in order to make a joyful noise to the Lord, in our sanctuary and beyond! A Sounds of John Wesley Task Force was formed.

Following the receipt of a generous donation designated for the sound system, we were immediately able to get the majority of the planned sound system improvements completed by Christmas 2019. In January 2020, the first needed phase of the organ repairs took place. Then Covid-19 entered the picture and the world came to a screeching halt. In June 2021 to re-revaluate the campaign, it was agreed the Carillon bells would be funded by Memorial funds and therefore removed from the campaign. (They were installed in 2021) By that time, the sound system modifications had been done and also Phase I of the organ repairs.

Therefore the Music Ministry Dream Fund and Phase II and III of the organ repairs remained as the unfinished portion of the campaign. In June of 2022, the Music Ministry Dream Fund morphed into John Wesley Music Lessons Ministry, with a drafted business plan, preliminary brochures, proposed contract documents, and a dedicated committee. Donations specific to that program were received. The Music Ministry Dream Fund was removed from the Sounds of John Wesley campaign in order to allow them to proceed at their own pace and funding, without having to report to the Capital Campaign. So the balance of the work remaining under the Sounds of John Wesley was the organ repairs. Based on having enough funds, we agreed to proceed with Phase II, which consists of releathering three more reservoirs. Phase II is a necessary repair but not an urgent repair. We paid the downpayment in order to hold the 2022 price and it will be worked into the schedule when they are able.


Note that our magnificent Moller organ is comprised of 36 registers for a total of 43 ranks and is insured for \$1,260,000 (replacement cost).

Phase II cost is \$17,200. We have paid the \$6,880 downpayment; the balance due will be \$10,320 when completed. Therefore that means we currently already have \$1,235.00 to start funding of Phase III, which shouldn't need to be done for another couple years— or for the Peterson console, should that fail first. The visual shown below is as of June 30. We remind you the Sounds of John Wesley giving envelopes are included with your regular envelopes.

# VALUABLE OUTREACH!

What a year it has been for us offering new, valuable outreach to neighbors in our immediate community! In addition to Micah's Backpack and the other difference-making outreach we've been offering for years, it has been such a blessing to venture into new outreach! Thanks to the terrific leadership of our new Committee on Relief (JW COR), we completed 2 coat giveaways last January and March, and we served an Easter Dinner at REACH. We already have a stock of coats heading into our next coat giveaway this October. Very soon, we will be having our next coat drive to add to that stock, for our October giveaway.

This summer we have been blessed to give away dozens of tents and sleeping bags, along with other supplies, to our neighbors with housing insecurity. We have carried out this giveaway in close consultation with Cindi Messersmith of Shepherd Pratt and other community professionals from the Hagerstown Homeless Coalition, which includes representatives from the Hagerstown Police Dept. We are very careful to give away these valuable supplies according to the clear guidelines provided by these partners. *Any donations you make to this outreach results in the giving of valuable supplies*, given in *strict accordance with our town's laws* and to best meet the needs of our neighbors!

# TRUSTEES PROPERTY COMMITTEE REPORT

We feel you will agree that since hiring Larry Gibson as Custodian/Caretaker, our church building has taken on an improved appearance. Not only cosmetically, but also a safer environment when entering the premises. Larry and Heather are always willing to do what is needed for the good of the church. And because they do many of those things as a team, Heather has also been offered some coordinating hours to mesh with Larry's responsibilities. Thank you, Larry and Heather!



Items to report on or update include:

Church Clean-Up Day was held on Saturday, June 3. About 20 volunteers came to help clean up and beautify the church property. Lunch was provided.

#### Church Building

- Four new large, updated directory signs have been hung. The existing signs were very outdated for anyone trying to find a specific location in the church.
- Repairs have been made to the floor area right inside the door of the Men's 1st floor Restroom. This has been an ongoing issue, that hopefully has now been resolved
- Roland Slate Service, out of Baltimore, has completed the work on the Trinity window dormers and some slate roof repairs. This included replacing missing slates on both the main sanctuary roof and lower Wesleyan Room roof area, reworking flashings, and scraping, painting reflashings, and replacing Plexiglas on all six dormers.
- The annual elevator tests have been completed.
- We have contracted with Blue/Gray Towing and added signs in the parking lot. We are cautious when removing any cars, making an attempt to locate the owner first. As of now we can still park in the Broad Axe parking lot on Sunday mornings, and also the City Market lot.
- The new trash dumpster is in place and seems to be working well. There are still two of the large trash barrels remaining for convenience since there is a lock on the dumpster.

#### Rowe Hall

• The ceiling in one of the closets is falling down as a result of some previous water damage. This is in the process of being replaced.



# **TRUSTEES PROPERTY COMMITTEE REPORT (CONTINUED)**

#### 131 N. Potomac Street

- An item of concern is the back sidewalk. There is some erosion of the (ramp) sidewalk at the highest elevation at the corner near the back of the house. We are currently evaluating this issue.
- There has also been some concern over shingles Larry found laying on the ground that have come off the roof. We may need to get a roofer to evaluate before it causes any leaks.

#### <u>Parsonage</u>

- There is a concern over the boiler causing the CO alarm to go off. There appears to be no obvious reason other than possibly a downdraft. But we need to evaluate and discuss a possible solution before heating season.
- Screened-in porch repairs and tree branch trimming should be complete.
