The 1st Sunday of Advent is December 1. Our sanctuary will be fully adorned with greens and wreaths, our Chrismon Tree, and the Advent Wreath! Again, it will be a sight to see! Again, all of it will remind us that the heartbeat of it all is the newborn Jesus, the Prince of Peace, the King of Kings, born in a stable and laid in a manger. The Chrismon Tree is especially helpful with this as it



signifies with its evergreen branches and its assortment of beautiful ornaments the valuable meanings of Christmas. This Advent, which means "Coming," we await again the Coming of Jesus at Christmas, while we await also the coming of Jesus into our lives again and again, day by day! PARISH NURSING MINISTRY - YOUR VACCINE CORNER

To help us all stay safe this winter and beyond, here are some healthy reminders when it comes to vaccines, and some general tips to help protect you from those nasty germs.

Parish Nurse

Flu Vaccine

Did you know that getting the flu vaccine can lower your risk of heart attack and death from cardiovascular disease by 30 percent? Flu season is now in full swing till spring. Please consider getting the vaccine if you haven't already, especially if you are 50 or older or have an existing medical problem or are immunocompromised. It's definitely not too late. It takes up to two weeks to build immunity after being vaccinated. If you are 65 or older, ask your doctor or pharmacist for the high dose vaccine which provides stronger protection against flurelated hospitalization or serious illness.

Covid-19 vaccine

We continue to see more cases of COVID circulating in our community. If you are 50 or older, please consider getting the updated COVID-19 vaccine. The virus has changed a lot over the last 3 or 4 years so without a recent vaccine, we have only "old" antibodies in our system, which don't help against the current COVID strains. Call your doctor if you're not sure whether you need the vaccine.

Some General TIPS on fighting those ever-present germs:

- 1) Remember that germs are carried into your body (nose, mouth, eyes) via your hands so don't touch your face with your hands.
- 2) Wash, wash, wash your hands frequently.
- 3) Keep hand sanitizer with you at all times, in your pocket, purse, and in your car, and get in the habit of using it every time you get in your car and before you eat in a restaurant (don't forget!).
- 4) Keep a COVID test kit on hand at all times. You never know when you'll need to test if you're feeling sick. The sooner you know whether you have COVID, the sooner you can call your doctor to discuss prescription medication which can shorten the duration and reduce the severity of the virus.

Next month we'll talk about the pneumonia vaccine and the RSV vaccine.



WESLEYAN CLASS SUNDAY SCHOOL

The Wesleyan Class meets at 9:00 on Sunday morning in the Wesleyan Room. We have a short devotion, a prayer and two hymns. We are currently using the Cokesbury Adult Bible Studies curriculum for our lessons. As we are getting ready to move into the winter quarter, we would like to share an excerpt from the Student book.

As we begin this season of Advent, we do so with a sense of anticipation, longing, and wonder. As children, we seemed to wait for Advent forever. But once it arrived, the church was immediately filled with all the symbols of the season.

As we move through this season together, our lessons will in some ways connect with the candles on the Advent wreath. We will first focus on hope for the future, hope for something better, and hope for what God has in store for us. Then we will consider love, especially love of neighbor. How does God call us to love one another more fully, and how does God define love in the birth of God's son?

Next, we will explore the joy that isn't defined by temporary happiness or emotion but comes from the fulfillment of a promise. As we light the peace candle, we will consider what it means for us to confess Jesus as the Prince of Peace who came for all. Finally, with the Christ candle, we will celebrate the birth of our Savior, the Savior for all.

During Advent, we are reminded that there was a time when the hope of the Messiah seemed like a faraway promise that would never be fulfilled. Today, we may be included to miss this message or take it for granted. This series of lessons inspires us to be compelled by faith and by a story that we know well, perhaps hearing it in new and different ways.

Allow this season of hope, love, joy, and peace to draw you to rest, finally at the foot of the manger. May this season bring new life, new understanding, and a stronger assurance of God's love for us.

We invite, and would love for you to also come and join us on a Sunday morning. We also welcome anyone who would like to be a guest teacher. We have a Teacher's Guide and Concise Commentary book to accompany the Student book. Contact Barbara Hoover or the church office for more information.

Altar Flowers





- Small green wooden craft sticks
- Scissors
- Ruler
- Bible
- Permanent marker
- Craft glue
- Optional: star stickers or craft jewels

What you do:

- 1. Place the large stick on a table vertically, like a tree trunk.
- 2. Cut the green sticks into pieces that measure 4", 3½", 3" and 2½".
- On each green stick, write a name for Jesus from Isaiah 9:6 —
 Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. (Write small or ask an adult for help.)
- Use a dot of glue to attach each green stick to the large stick, like tree branches.
- 5. Decorate your Christmas tree with stickers or jewels.


