


As we strive after every resolution and goal this New Year, we are blessed by the wind Jesus is beneath our wings, making us new day by day!

BUILDING USE POLICY

As we move into 2024, we need to remind you of the building use policy.

This policy is important so that we know who is using the building, when it is being used, what area is being used, and for what purpose. That is so we have no conflicts in scheduling, so that the area will be ready for use, so that the cleaning company can be aware of any scheduled events and can adjust their schedule accordingly.

For the use of space by a group or committee within the church, it is only necessary to give that information to Karen or myself. Karen will keep a master calendar in the office.

Committee meetings that are held on a regular basis and scheduled Coffee Fellowship dates are not required to notify each time, as that information should already be noted in the office.

For use of space by an individual (member) for a small gathering or event, you will be asked to complete a Building Use Form, giving information on requested date(s), requested space, and purpose. Trustees will approve or reject the request.

For use of space by an outside individual or group, a Building Use Form will need to be completed, giving information on requested date(s), requested space and purpose. A fee and/or certificate of insurance may be required. Trustees will review for approval.

Note use of the kitchen is monitored by the Kitchen Committee and has a separate scheduling calendar. Our Kitchen is a commercial kitchen, licensed under the Washington County Health Department. The Building Use Form has a section for separate kitchen use, which will be shared with the Kitchen Committee.

You can check with Karen for availability of a date or space. We thank you in advance for your consideration of notifying the office of expected use of areas in the church building.




WEDNESDAYS HEAVENLY LIVING WORKSHOP



The Sounds of John Wesley — Capital Campaign - UPDATE Phase II Organ Repairs Scheduled



The following is an update as of November 30, 2023.

Our Goal: 2019 Sound System Upgrade \$11,000 (done)

Phase I Organ Repairs 6,500 (done)

Phase II Organ Repairs 17,200 (scheduled) *

Phase III Organ Repairs 10,700 (2022 estimate)

Future Phase IV (Peterson Console) <u>13,000</u> (2022 estimate)

\$ 58,400 (approximate)

To date we have raised \$37,155.

We have completed the 2019 Sound System Upgrade, Phase I of the organ repairs, and paid the downpayment for Phase II in order to hold the price.

*Lawless has scheduled our Phase II repairs to begin on January 2. That repair consists of releathering three more reservoirs. The reservoirs will be removed and taken to their shop to be rebuilt. That also means our organ will be down for the January 7 worship service.

Phase II balance due is **\$10,320**. That means we currently have **\$2,455** to start the funding of Phase III, which can be expected in the next few years.

Our magnificent Moller organ is comprised of 36 registers for a total of 43 ranks and is insured for a \$1,332,000 replacement cost.

In order to reach our total goal we will need **\$21,245**. We remind you the Sounds of John Wesley giving envelopes are included with your regular envelopes.

I will bring some already prepared dough and demonstrate making it as well. Everyone will learn to fry the donuts.


These will be cake donuts rather than ones made with yeast. We learned to use yeast last year.

PUZZLE PAGE



Geodes look plain on the outside but contain beautiful crystals. Create these "rocks" to show how God makes us new on the inside.

What you need:

 Clean cardboard egg carton



- Scissors (and adult help)
- Epsom salt
- Plastic zippered bags (one per color of dye)
- Food coloring
- Glue
- Paintbrush



What you do:

- 1. Cut out the tops and bottoms of all the egg compartments so you can make 6 ball shapes.
- 2. In each bag, put 3 tablespoons of Epsom salt and a drop or two of food coloring. Seal and shake to mix.
- 3. With the paintbrush, spread glue inside two egg-carton halves. Sprinkle a spoonful of Epsom salt into those halves. Then close and shake.
- 4. Open your homemade geode and shake out excess salt.
- 5. Optional: Preserve the crystals with a coat of clear-drying glue.
