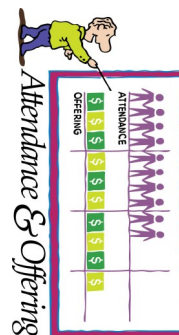

BUILDING USE POLICY

As we move into 2026, we need to remind you of the building use policy.

As more individuals and groups use our facilities, this policy is important so that we know who is using the building, when it is being used, what area is being used, and for what purpose. That is so we have no conflicts in scheduling, so that the area will be ready for use, so that the cleaning company can be aware of any scheduled events and can adjust their schedule accordingly.



For a one-time use of space by a group or committee within the church, it is only necessary to give that information to Karen or myself. Karen will keep a master calendar in the office.

Committee meetings that are held on a regular basis and scheduled Coffee Fellowship dates are not required to notify each time, as that information should already be noted in the office. Only a change in the normal schedule needs to be shared.

A newly planned event or activity that will happen on a recurring basis needs to be set up by completing a Building Use Form for Church Committees, giving information on requested space, purpose, and scheduled dates.

For use of space by an individual (member) for a small private gathering or event, you will be asked to complete a Building Use Form, giving information on the requested date, requested space, and purpose. Trustees Building Use Committee will approve or reject the request.

For use of space by an outside individual or group, a Building Use Form will need to be completed, giving information on requested date(s), requested space and purpose. A fee and/or certificate of insurance may be required. Trustees Building Use Committee will review for approval.

Note use of the kitchen is monitored by the Kitchen Committee and has a separate scheduling calendar. Our Kitchen is a commercial kitchen, licensed under the Washington County Health Department. The Building Use Form has a section for separate kitchen use, which will be shared with the Kitchen Committee, if use of the kitchen is requested for an event.

For use of the kitchen only, there is a separate Kitchen Use form. A fee and/or certificate of insurance may be required. Trustees Building Use Committee, along with the Kitchen Committee, will review for approval.

And for anyone interested in holding a wedding in our amazing sanctuary at John Wesley UMC, there is a newly revised wedding policy in regards to revitalizing our wedding ministry. That policy can be requested through the church office.

You can check with Karen for availability of a date or space. We thank you in advance for your consideration of notifying the office of expected use of areas in the church building.

“Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight.” - Proverbs 3:5-6

As we step into a new year together, I want to invite our whole church family to pause for a moment...not to make resolutions, but to make room. Room for the Holy Spirit. Room for God's direction. Room for the unexpected ways the Lord will lead us in 2026.

Proverbs 3:5-6 reminds us that a straight path doesn't come from figuring everything out on our own, but from *trusting, submitting, and walking* in step with God's Spirit. A NOTE FROM THE KITCHEN COMMITTEE

Our kitchen is a commercial kitchen, licensed under the Washington County Health Department. It is important that we follow certain guidelines.

In the past year or so we have increased our kitchen use extensively.

- * Jay Travato – aka Senor’s Cookies – uses the kitchen every Monday to bake his wonderful cookies.
- * WNA starts off with a meal – prepared in our kitchen – every Wednesday.
- * Every Sunday, Janessa Chapman prepares lunches to be delivered to about 65 individuals through our Lunches with Love program.
- * We have been preparing three to five Community Meals a year to share with our neighborhood folks.
- * And that does not include our normal Sunday Coffee Fellowship times or our congregational meals and fellowship get-togethers, along with other special events.



There are many expenses to keep our kitchen in acceptable condition to pass the renewal of the Health Department license, such as annual maintenance inspection of the appliances, and repairs to the appliances – commercial appliances are expensive to repair or replace; a recent burner replacement on the stove was \$500. Kitchen Committee pays for new pots and pans, new knives, pancake syrup dispensers, etc. - things that are specific to kitchen use. We have added a filtering system to the ice machine, fixed a line in the dishwasher, replaced the single door refrigerator, replaced the old kitchen table with a new stainless steel table, and then more recently purchased a new double door commercial refrigerator.

We are asking that those who use the kitchen do two important things. First, make sure you sign up for use of the kitchen so that we don't have an overlap of people trying to use the kitchen. (And then be sure to sign the log-in sheet in the kitchen). Secondly, please treat our JW kitchen as if it were your own kitchen in your own home. Treat the appliances as you would your own. Clean up any spills, wipe them down when needed. Be sure to mark your food. Do not leave unused food in the refrigerator or freezer indefinitely. Before you leave, make sure everything is cleaned up and washed. Mop up any spills on the floor. And if anything is broken, missing, or low in supply, let us know so that we can address it for the next user.

With the current additional usage of the kitchen, we all need to work together to keep it in proper condition to continue to be registered as a commercial kitchen.

We want to be able to continue to enjoy the food and fellowship that comes from a church kitchen!

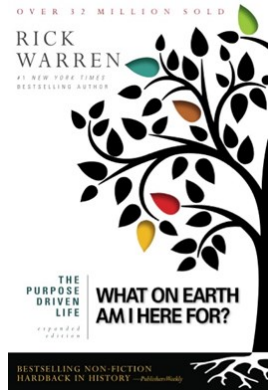

TRUSTEES/PROPERTY COMMITTEE REPORT

As we look back at 2025, Trustees had a busy year and finished some larger projects. And found some new ones to be addressed.

Some of those completed projects include:

~ CHURCH BUILDING

- ◆ Install a new Custodian/Utility closet, complete with mop sink
- ◆ Renovations to first floor Ladies restroom, which enabled us to also create a separate Unisex restroom

~ ROWE HALL BUILDING

- ◆ Repairs prior to new tenants, Smile Back Records, moving into the building

~ 131 NORTH POTOMAC STREET

- ◆ Brick and mortar repair work to the house and to the stone wall
- ◆ Support poles added in the basement
- ◆ Gas boiler removed and replaced with a heat pump system

Some larger projects we are currently working on include:

- * Flat rubber roof on Rowe Hall to be replaced
- * Repairs to the organ includes upgrading the combination action component
- * As of this writing we are currently investigating a high water bill for the church building, indicating the probability of a leak in the water line.

A Trustee's work is never done. Especially when you have older buildings like ours.

Maintenance on an older building can sometimes be rather challenging. We remind you that we are still using the Building Fund envelopes that come with your weekly offering envelopes.

Thank you for helping to keep our buildings welcoming. If you see an item of concern, report it.

We all need to work to keep our buildings beautiful and safe.

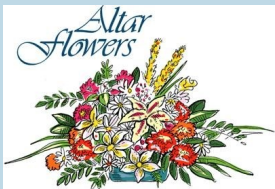
So have a little bit of coffee and a whole lot of Jesus on Sunday morning!

The Bible we use is translated into English from other languages.
