#### "New Things This Summer!"

"And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making all things new."

— Revelations 21:5

Healthy churches take a break during the summer. We catch our breath. We encourage and rejoice with our members as they go on vacations and spend valuable time alone or with family and friends doing their favorite things and going to favorite places. An important way we encourage and support our members in this way is that we take a break ourselves! We don't adequately support self-care unless we model it!

At the same time, healthy churches remain active in the summer and ensure that ministry momentum is sustained. While we want, when possible, for valuable volunteers to get a break from the grind of their weekly responsibilities, we want everyone in our church family to continue their growth as disciples and be nourished from unique ministry opportunities that the summer presents. As we see above, Jesus is busy "making all things new", and that doesn't stop in the summer, so we surely want to be a part of it!

There are at least 2 new things this summer through which Jesus will be making us new!

One of these new things is that we as a congregation will begin to ponder and discuss together what direction we will choose to follow as a church family. Since last November, a team including me, 4 lay leaders from our church, and 3 other clergy from our district has met regularly to thoroughly assess both the current condition and also the potential of our church. I wrote about this

assessment in more detail in my Pastor's Message in last November's Partner. This assessment is based on Paragraph 213 of our Book of Discipline and is titled, "A Process for Assessment of Local Church Potential." That's a long title, so we've been calling this process "213."



All of our 213 work will lead to OUR CONGREGATION making a choice about where we go from here. Based on our assessments, the 213 Team is preparing a list of possible COURSES OF ACTION that we may take. This summer will present opportunity for US ALL to learn the different options, become more fully informed, and offer our feedback. We will NOT rush this vital decision about the course of action we choose. After taking valuable time this summer to digest our options, we will gather ALTOGETHER in the fall to complete our discernment and to make our decision.

A second new thing this summer will be our first "Family Festival" taking place each Thursday evening in July. Modeled after Vacation Bible School, a primary intent of this summer program is to invite, welcome, and meet new children and their families from our community. Our Family Festival is offered weekly on Thursdays in July, to make it more manageable and accessible to our volunteers. We are also joining with Grace UMC, just a mile away in West Hagerstown, to offer our Festival. Grace will host the Festival on July 6 & 20. John Wesley will host on July 13 & 27. Participating children and their families will attend at both sites, and our volunteer team will serve at both sites.

Each evening will begin at 5 pm with a short meal for the kids, their families, and our volunteers. We'll continue until 7 pm with a series of music, activity, games, and arts and crafts that will keep the kids moving and having a ball. Each evening will have a Bible-based theme and message. The themes and messages will be taught through each meal, song, activity, game, and artistic expression.

Please prayerfully consider how you will be a part of our Family Festival. It promises to be a rich fellowship between our church family and our family of neighbors. How would you like to help? ... with the meal? ... with the games? ... with music? ... with arts and crafts? ... with registration? ... with a food donation? ... with a monetary donation? ... with your presence, sitting in a chair, and cheering the kids on? Whether or not you join us in any of the ways above, you will bless us by praying for this new ministry!

May you be richly blessed this Summer with the variety of ways our Jesus is "making all things new"!

#### FLOWER ARRANGING AT CREATIVE SATURDAY






## BALTIMORE-WASHINGTON ANNUAL CONFERENCE of the United Methodist Church



- Pencil


#### What you do:

- 4. Add pages as needed. Carefully roll up the timeline to keep for generations to come.


