A year ago, we were learning the results of a comprehensive selfassessment that we had completed as a church. We reviewed together what the assessment said about the health of our church leadership, our finances, the condition of our buildings and grounds, and the quality of our connection with our immediate community. Based upon this self-assessment, we voted as a congregation last June to maintain our level of investment in our ministry, mission, and staffing, for the sake of pressing on toward the goal of church revitalization.

Since the June, 2024 vote, our lay leadership has been hard at work setting goals for the planning and the execution of new ministry and the growth of current ministry, all for the sake of growing the vitality of our discipleship! As a result, we have begun a new midweek ministry, Wednesday Night Alive (WNA), that is off to an excellent start since its opening this past January. WNA has already nurtured the formation of a new, emerging Young Adult Fellowship. We have welcomed new ministry partners into our space and into our mission. Mark Smith has located his pretzel and nut business in our church. Tony Williams and his friend Derek Williams have moved their record label, Smile Back Records, into Rowe Hall. And most recently, Janessa Chapman has joined our Service Team and used our kitchen to offer her Sunday lunch feeding ministry, Lunches with Love! And Jay Trovato is back with Senor's Cookies!

It has been a rich blessing to experience all of this wonderful growth and the added vitality it has brought to John Wesley. In looking back at this last year of progress, we see that much of our new direction has been led and experienced by our laity who are active in leadership. We see that it is vital to engage more of our entire congregation in the venture we committed to last June!



TRUSTEES PROPERTY COMMITTEE REPORT

Trustees Property Committee met in April. We have several in-house projects that are nearing completion and several projects on the schedule with contractors.

The courtyard garden has come alive! The grass has come in thick and green. Mulching has taken place. Tulips have been blooming in the middle of the garden – they managed to survive and find their way through the sod.



We are happy to report we survived the horrific storm the night of April 19 with very little water or other damage. Storms such as that are always a concern for our lovely, old building.

Projects nearing completion include:

- We have converted the first floor Ladies restroom into a 2-stall Ladies restroom and a single unisex restroom, by expanding into the utility closet area. Therefore, a new utility closet has been relocated on the first floor, near the Men's restroom. We still need a plumber to hook up the mop sink and some finishing work.
- New Basement Area Storage Closet just needs some finish work.
- A space in the Custodian's office has been framed up for a new storage area for the Service Team.

Projects scheduled in the near future include:

- Repairs to kitchen floor due to previous water damage from ice machine.
- Brick and mortar repairs to the gable of 131 N. Potomac and stonework repairs to some of the stonewalls. Gruber-Latimer has us now tentatively on the schedule for the first of June.
- A dip in the rear parking lot and some other concrete repairs to be addressed. Some filler has been added to lessen the dip.
- We will be getting a quote from Heidler Roofing to address the flat rubber roof on Rowe Hall. Some pinholes were repaired over the winter, but the rubber is starting to pull away from the sides.
- TG Services will be replacing the boiler at 131 N. Potomac Street with a total heat pump system.

Routine maintenance and repair items continue to happen daily, weekly, and monthly...and unexpectedly.

THE SOUNDS OF JOHN WESLEY CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

We thank those of you who elected to choose The Sounds of John Wesley to receive your Lenten Fundraiser Celebration offering. All of the remaining work revolves around the organ and the ongoing need for repairs and updating.

Currently our organ is insured for a \$1,404,000 replacement cost. The organ was built by M.P. Moller in Hagerstown in 1921, and subsequently rebuilt by Moller in 1942 and 1963. The organ was again rebuilt by the Reuter Organ Company in Lawrence, KS in 1993, but was not completely releathered at that time. Therefore the reason for a lot of this recent work we have had done, or are expecting to have done in the near future.

We set it up in phases according to priority. Phase I and Phase II have been completed, and also the replacement of a rectifier. A second rectifier in the console will probably need replaced in the near future. Work already completed in Phase I and Phase II totaled \$34,700.00.

To quickly summarize where we are, using the updated prices in 2024, future work would include:

Rectifier re	500.00	
Phase III	Expression Motor replacement	12,700.00
Phase IV	Peterson Combination Action	<u>15,000.00</u>
FUTURE WORK TO COMPLETE \$ 28,200.00		

Our last "report card" noted the overall condition of the organ as - Good: occasional problems; no anticipated repairs. However, there are two pedals that recently have been having some issues and do not play. In order to correct that problem, we are looking at both chests needing to be releathered. Our organ company, Lewis & Hitchcock (aka Lawless) is evaluating what might be involved and the cost, which would then be added to the figure shown above.

As of March 31, we had a balance of \$14,685.00 in the fund to put towards accomplishing the needed repairs when it becomes necessary. That figure does not include the recent Lenten donations.

The estimate figures shown above do not include a contingency for routine maintenance or unexpected repairs. The organ is very sensitive to temperature and humidity and gets tuned twice a year; once in the summer, once in the winter.

We thank the congregation for your continued support of the Sounds of John Wesley Capital Campaign. We thank you for your prayers, your commitment and your generosity to make this happen to keep our magnificent organ in quality condition. We also remind you that there are Sounds of JW envelopes included in your monthly giving envelope packet, or you can specify in your online giving.
