Pastor's Report to Church Conference "It's About the Journey!"

For me, what stands out about our past year at John Wesley and my role in it as Pastor is how pleased I am and how excited I am about our Journey. I'm most pleased with the Journey we've shared and continue to follow! What a race it has been! It's been full of persevering faith, full of service, full of generosity, full of fruit, and full of humility that seeks God's Will above ours!

We spent the bulk of our year completing the UM Discipline's Paragraph 213 Assessment of Church Vitality. With our District Superintendent John Wunderlich, I led our 213 Task Force of 4 laity from our church and 3 additional pastors from neighboring United

We worked hard to comprehensively assess our health, so that we might choose a course of action based on that assessment. I am so pleased at how we did! As a result, we have a clearer sense of direction, based on a hard, long, healthy look in the mirror, with God's help and Jesus' leading.

We put so much of our heart and soul into our 213 process that we took too long to do it, because we were so conscientious about including every point of view and caring about the ability of each of our members to understand it and then be able to act on it. Our fine-toothed comb may have been a bit too fine-toothed. Yet, at the same time, our journey through 213 was full of Holy Conferencing, and that's what matters most. We listened to and heard each other, and we respected each other, and we trusted that each of us was seeking and discerning the Holy Spirit's leading as best we could.

From our 213 journey, we have chosen to continue seeking Vitality as a growing church making Disciples for Jesus Christ in Downtown Hagerstown. And another thing I love about our Journey this year, is that we did not wait until our June vote on a Course of Action, to continue the significant progress we've been making toward revitalization these last several years. It has been my blessing and honor to lead this journey and its progress!

Our Youth Ministry has had another remarkable year. Our Youth Group grew from 6 youth to 12! Two new families with youth became active at our church, and all of their youth were welcomed into our Youth Ministry, with our strong youth ministry being a primary reason that these families were drawn to our church. Our youth embrace new adventures, and it showed in the new dimension added to their fellowship and ministry! They shared fellowship and outreach with youth from other churches. They added new twists on their growing friendship with the Veterans at



the Northpoint Veterans Home! They completed their 2nd original Christmas Pageant, and even more of our youth represented John Wesley and our District as Delegates at Annual Conference! What a year! ... full of NEW stuff!

Our revitalized Mission has had another year of growth. Our Service team organized and offered 2 community meals, each serving over 200 of our neighbors. The team will also support a 3rd meal to Veterans in November, near the Veterans Day holiday! An amazing blessing this year has been the growth in congregational participation in these events! 15-25 disciples from our church family have helped prepare and serve the meals. We are also enjoying deepened partnerships with our neighboring United Methodist churches. 5-15 disciples from other churches assist regularly in our outreach.

We are working hard with our 213 follow-up to plan for reaching new families in our community. We believe we can draw young families again to our church. To do so, we must develop new ministry serving families with children. We are excited about our key role with HARC in developing new After-School programming serving our community. We have already succeeded in creating over 40 new clubs for the coming school year that will serve 18 children per club! Amazing! That's over 300 new children that will be served with this valuable outreach that gives kids after-school fun with great new content, while their parents can work a fuller day more worry-free of child-care needs. This outreach will give us opportunity to connect further with these children from these neighborhood schools and their families!

This year, we have progressed on Sundays at drawing, welcoming, and keeping guests, who are becoming active in our church! Our congregation is looking more like our community! It has been a joy to plan and craft worship with our Celebration Team and with our outstanding Director of Music Ministry, Stephen Pompa. I am enjoying worship leadership and my preaching as much as I ever have!

I'm blessed to lead this growth alongside our faithful laity and dedicated, gift lay leadership!

I continue to enjoy my pastoral visitation and pastoral care, through home, hospital, and nursing home visitation. It is also a great joy to support to ongoing growth of your discipleship and the discipleship of all our John Wesley church family! I am active in the equipping of our leading disciples, for their own disciple-making. I am active with them in Bible Study, visitation, consultation, dreaming together with them, and encouraging them. I taught Confirmation and confirmed 6 youth this year. I also enjoyed teaching an adult New Members Class with 3 adults.

What a journey it has all been! I am so pleased with our journey together in 2024! I am excited for 2025, as we continue to face steep challenges and wonderful opportunity together, with our Lord Jesus Christ and Almighty, Awesome God by our sides, for whom nothing is impossible!

NEWS FROM MICAH'S BACKPACK

The shelves are restocked, and the first set of bags have been delivered!

We are looking forward to another great year working with Ruth Ann Monroe Primary School. Once again there are four churches sponsoring at RAMPS. Combined we have the capacity to feed 95 students and John Wesley will be sponsoring 20 of them.



That means by the end of May, John Wesley will have packed approximately 800 backpacks with equals about 1,600 snacks and 3,200 fruit cups. The four churches combined can deliver up to 3,800 bags with 7,600 snacks and 15,200 fruit cups to just that one school.







TRUSTEES PROPERTY COMMITTEE REPORT

Just a reminder that as we continue to use the spaces in our building more, coordination is important. Church groups can use the Social Hall (or any other rooms in the church) but if it's not a regular reoccurring event, it needs to be cleared with the church office or Trustees Property Committee so that it can be put on the calendar. This is especially important with Kitchen Use. There is also a log-in sheet posted in the kitchen that needs to be signed when the kitchen is used. (Our regularly scheduled Coffee Fellowship is the exception to that.) Outside groups wanting to use space need to fill out a Building Use Form to be approved by the Property Committee.



As we move into the 4th quarter of the year, we are looking at a list of pending items. We hope to get as many as possible done this year.

Some of those items include:

- Finishing the Courtyard Memorial Garden
- Finishing the recent work being done in the basement of Rowe Hall
- Waiting for a price for new baseboard heaters in the basement area (NA group meeting space)
- Need to review quotes for stonework repairs in various areas around the church and determine priority
- Brick and mortar repair work to be done on the exterior of 131 N. Potomac (where water is seeping into the attic)
- The double door commercial refrigerator in the kitchen has failed and needs to be replaced before the Mummers' Parade
- Need to evaluate the dip in the rear parking lot before winter
- We have been experiencing a high water bill, which appears to be focusing on the Education wing. We had several of the toilets rebuilt and hope this will resolve the problem.
- A new 2-sink countertop and cabinet to be installed in the first floor Ladies Restroom
- There are plans to create a separate single unisex restroom beside the 1st floor Ladies Restroom
- Roof repairs have been made to both the main church building and to Rowe Hall
- The annual maintenance inspection has been done on the boilers in all three locations.

As usual, the Trustees Property Committee is busy with lots of projects to finish and some repairs to be addressed.

- Permanent marker




What you do:
