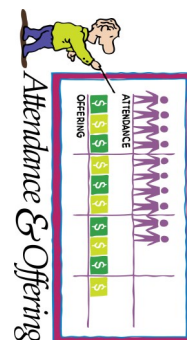

Welcome to the 2025/2026 School Year

We are delighted to begin another school year with the continued support of our dedicated volunteers. Thank you to everyone who has already committed to helping with Micah's Backpacks this year. 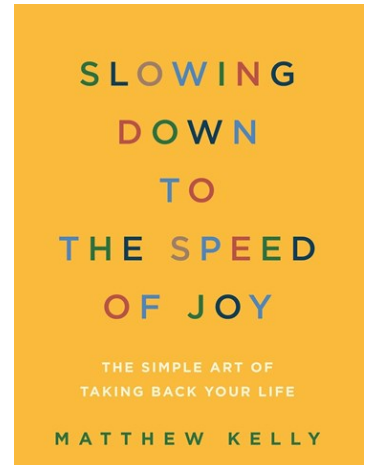
But then something changed.

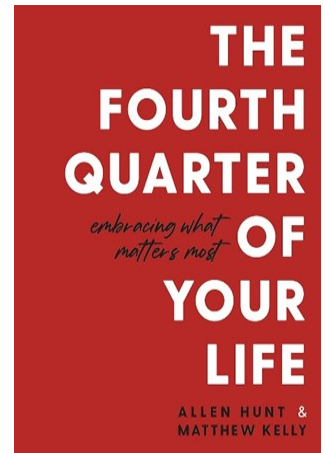

## MY THOUGHTS — A PEEK INSIDE



It's that time when Karen reminds me that she is working on the newsletter and asks me if I have something to contribute. To be honest, I'm not sure what else God is asking me to do.

I've been at John Wesley now for seven months working diligently with your Leadership Team to define Missional Alignment. The Leadership Team has made great strides as a Team; but, the challenges are the same. According to the 213 Report, John Wesley is a downtown church, with an aging congregation that is currently not able to meet their monthly expenses through envelope giving. These facts have not changed and I don't think any of us expect they will magically disappear unless we face the facts and make tough decisions that reflect our desire to be a church that transforms lives.

The Baltimore-Washington Conference has challenged each church to:

**“Make disciples for Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.”**

That's a pretty tall order. But what if EVERY CHURCH in Hagerstown believed this... lived this... and acted in ways that made this a reality?

Jesus said the poor will be with you always. He also said that we should care for the least, the last and the lost. But how does an aging congregation do that?

First, we can all welcome the stranger. Make a point to say Good Morning to someone across the aisle that you don't know. Hospitality is a spiritual gift. Our traditional greeting during the Passing of the Peace is: “The Peace of God be with you! And also with you!” Imagine someone not feeling the peace of God that morning. You have the power to give it.

Second, we can all give generously back a portion to the church what God has so generously given to us. Everything we have comes from God. We don't own a thing that God hasn't provided. If we truly are thankful, then we will want to show God our appreciation by being generous.

Third, we can all offer forgiveness. Envision a church where grudges are laid at the altar and amends are made so that we are all working together to transform this small corner of God's world. The hymn “They will know we are Christians by our Love” says it best, but if you prefer a scripture, read again, I Corinthians 13:1-13.

Finally, we can all pray for this church and the folks who lead it. Continue to hold the Leadership Team in your prayers as they wrestle with many issues.

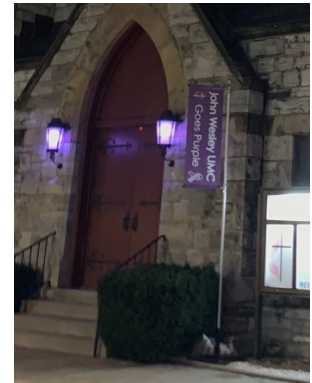

## JOHN WESLEY GOES PURPLE!

September is Addiction Awareness Month and it's time to "go purple"! Their mission is to foster open, honest conversations that educate youth about the dangers of prescription pill misuse, drugs, and alcohol. By equipping them with the knowledge to make healthy choices, we empower them to prevent addiction. As a community, we are committed to eliminating stigma, ensuring that individuals struggling with substance use or mental health challenges feel supported and are not afraid to seek help. Washington Goes Purple has been working to help educate our youth and community about the dangers of prescription pill misuse and other drugs and alcohol. Did you know 91 or more people die every day from heroin or prescription painkiller overdose? Washington Goes Purple is a substance misuse awareness education movement to encourage our community and youth to stand up against substance abuse.



18% of high school students report taking a prescription drug without a prescription and perceive fewer risks associated with misusing or abusing prescription stimulants than did their peers in 2009. We also know that in areas with high percentages of depression, there are high percentages of overdoses. Unfortunately, when an estimated 75-82% of heroin users begin with prescription painkillers, it's time to talk honestly to them and help #preventaddiction in the future.

## LUNCHES WITH LOVE MINISTRY

As the cold weather approaches us, there will be a need for additional help from 11-12:45 pm. If anyone would like to sign up to volunteer, I just ask that you volunteer for a few Sundays in a row so you can learn the way *LwL* does things. Also I would like to spend those Sundays helping one person at a time. If you want to sign up, please speak with me.

*LwL* is based solely on donations and yes, I do get donations; however, we are sharing 60 lunches now instead of the 40 some. We are also preparing PBJ sandwiches as extras for our friends in the community. As you can imagine, donations don't last as long as they did. If at anytime anyone would like to donate any food items already made, pantry staples or monetary donations, I would be more than grateful. As of today, we need jelly, bread, flip top sandwich baggies (they are \$1.88 @ Walmart for 200) and also large size lunch bags (for soups and things in bigger containers). I try not to ask for donations from *JW* because you do provide *LwL* a full kitchen and storage and that alone is a blessing.

I have big dreams for *LwL*, I want to expand, reach more people, feed more people, welcome more people to the church. I would like for church members to see and understand the need for my food ministry or any food ministry. It takes a village and I would like it if *LwL* and *JW* could work together and be the village. Every Sunday there is a new face or 5....that just goes to show more people are in need and more people are hearing about *LwL* and what we are about and the "real food" that is being made. (I have been told a few times, that they wait for my lunches because I cook like their Mom/Grandma. And it gives them a little piece of home.) As I have stated before, I don't turn down donations, anything at all is greatly appreciated and I will put it to good use. Some of you all know, I can make something out of nothing. Yesterday August 17th, *LwL* handed out 62 complete lunches, 18 PBJ sandwiches (if they ask for extra this is what I give them) and around 15 extra waters. All of this costs \$0 out of pocket because of the wonderful donations we received.

A huge thank you to all for allowing me to come into your church and have a food ministry. I'm sure it was probably a little more than what some expected, hopefully in a good way. Our work here is not done, it's just the beginning and I'm hoping some will want to be a part of the magic we are gonna make happen.

Use this treat to remind kids that Jesus is our Good Shepherd.

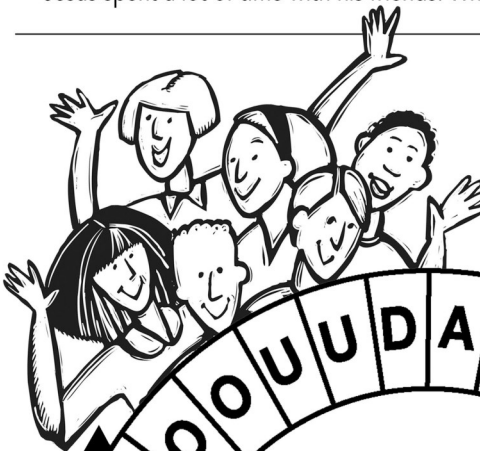
